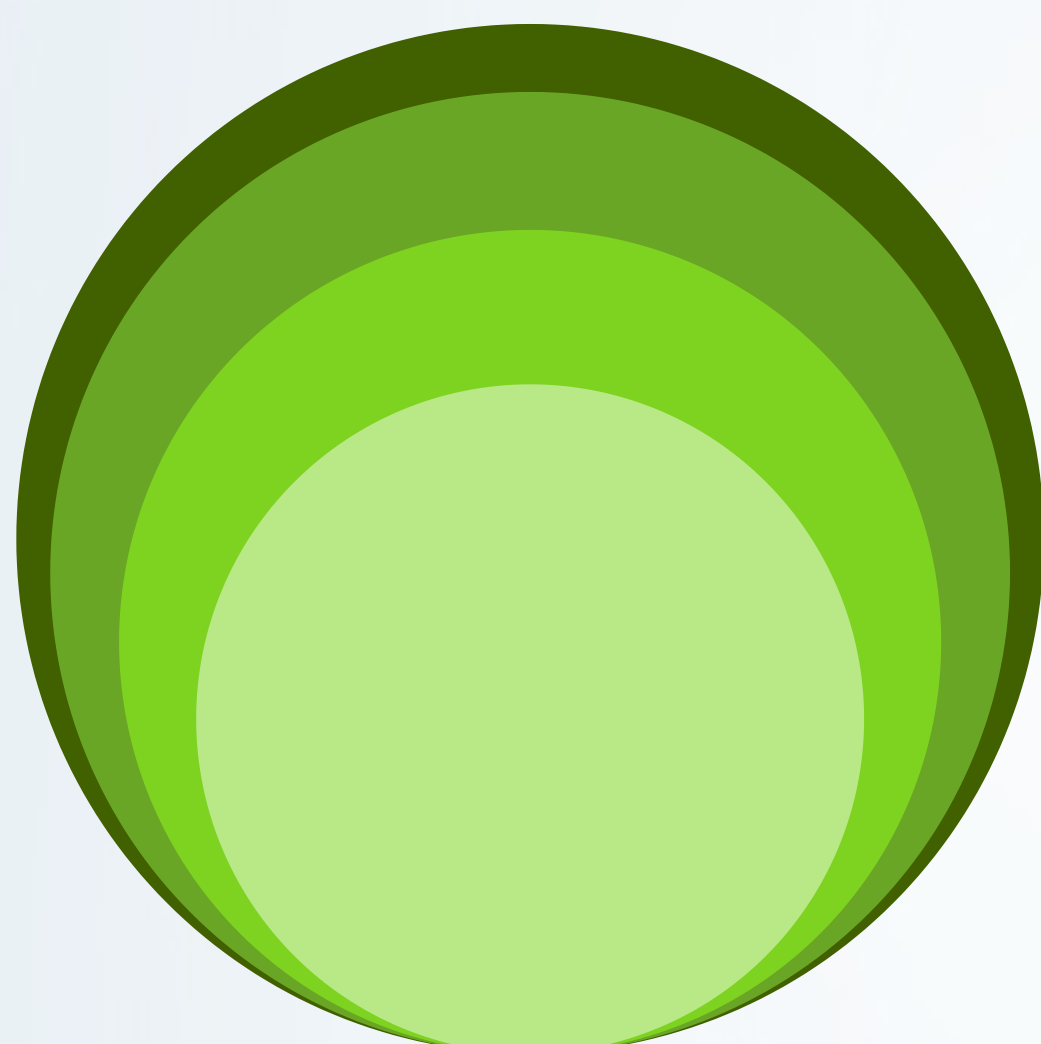

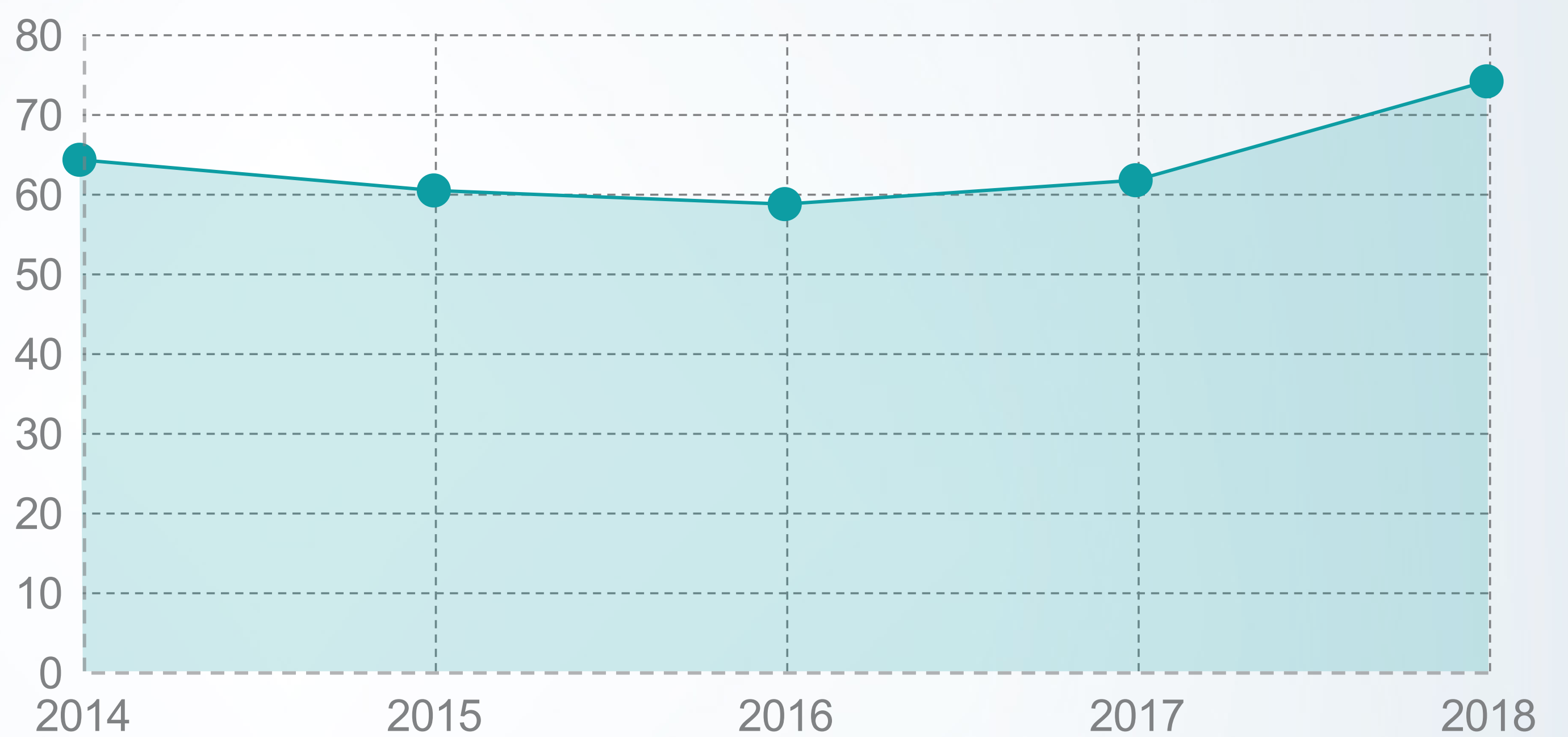
Average number of knife crimes* per month

Average number of assaults per month



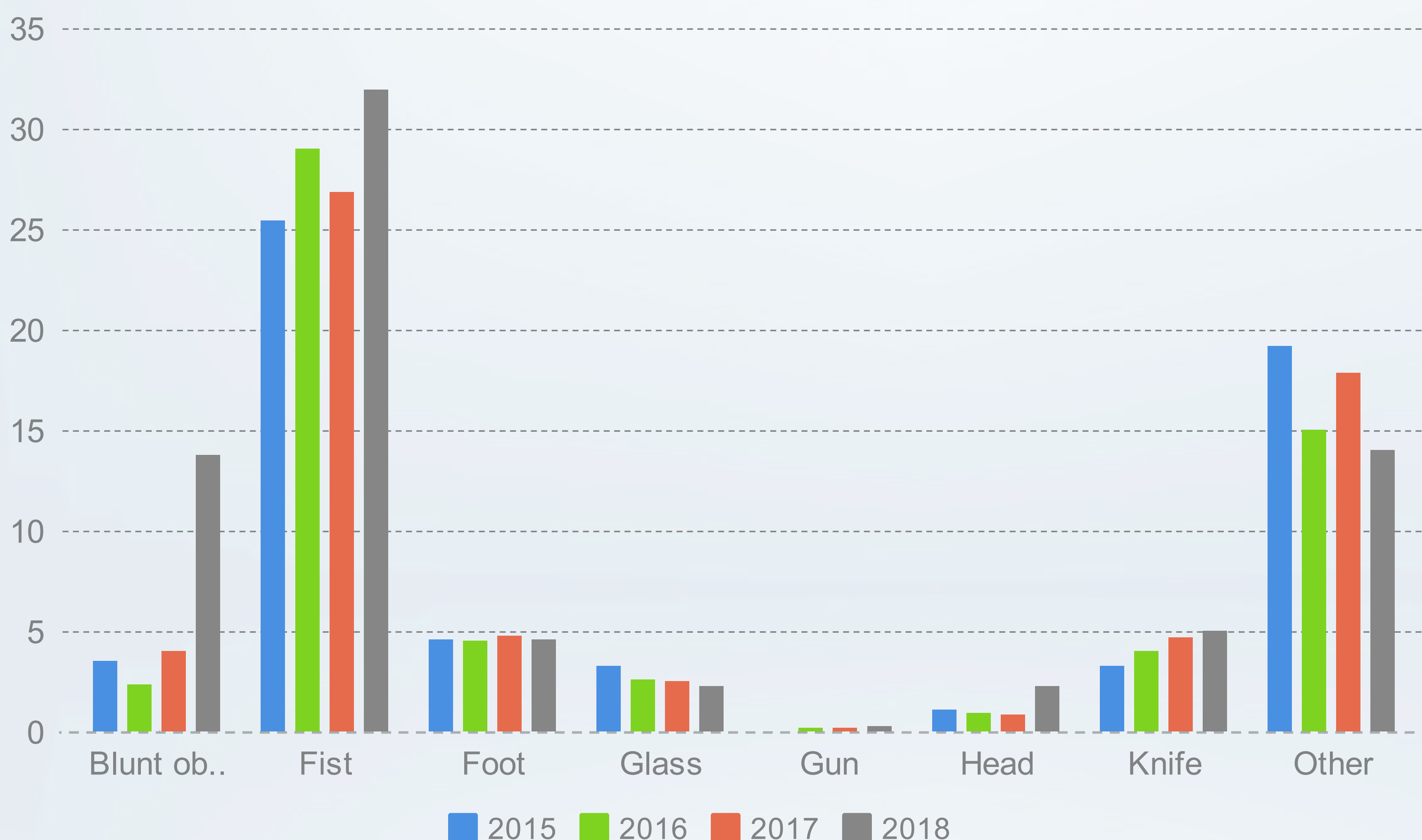
Monthly Average

The overall number of assault admissions to Addenbrooke's Emergency Department (ED) had been declining, but has risen in the past couple of years. 2018 saw a 20% rise in the average monthly arrivals for assault at the ED.

The number of victims of knife assaults* has also been increasing over the past three years.

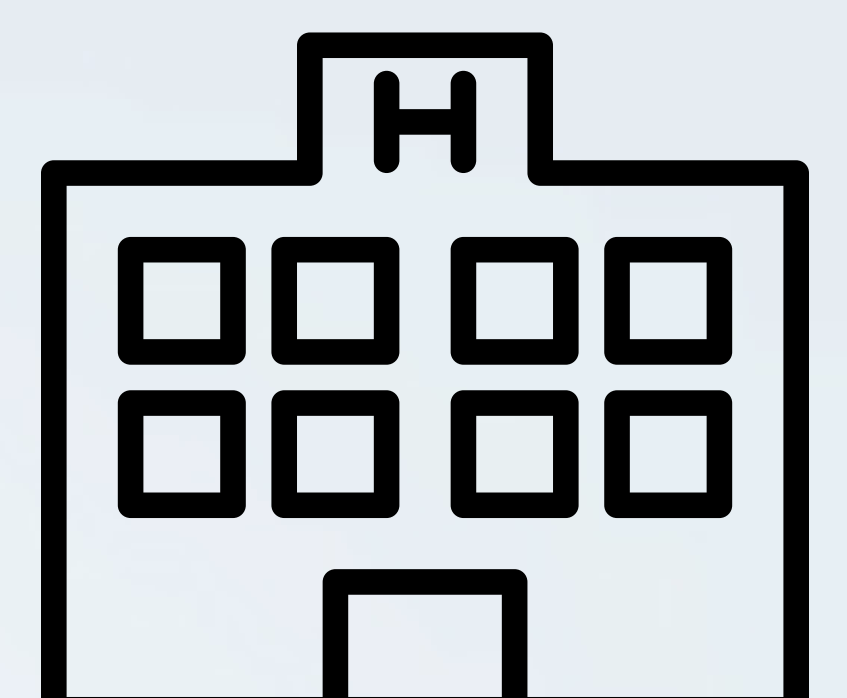

Average number of monthly ED assault admissions, by assault method



A number of different assault methods have been behind the recent increase in Addenbrooke's ED attendances for assault.

In particular, 2018 saw a particularly large number of victims of assault from a blunt object / force (including pushing).
