## At the end of Year 2...

*So far we have received 1,303 referrals and had 459 preventions.*

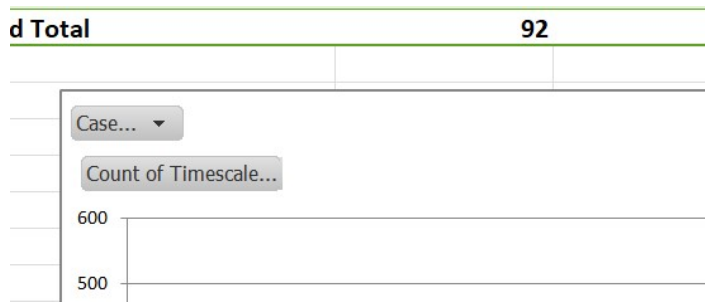
*If we count the cases where there has been successful contact with the client, an outcome has been recorded (not an open case) and they were not referred to a local authority (~pre-56 days) we end up with a prevention success rate of 61.4%.*

*This is well above the national average (around 55%) and is a prevention almost every work day since the team has been taking referrals.*

## 2. Quick review of stats from the start of the project to April 2019

To the end of March 2019, overall the team has taken 1,138 referrals; 1,031 of these were completed by the end of March 2019. A further 84 are in progress and 23 not started yet.

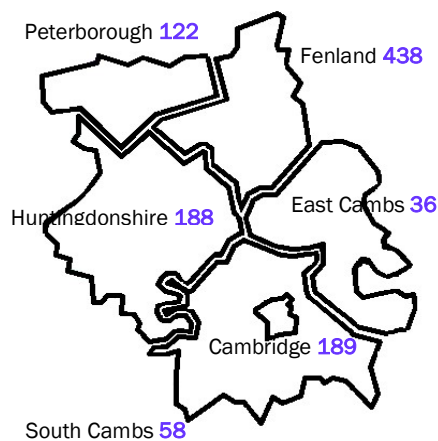
- 774 had more than 56 days warning of homelessness (these are the Trailblazer team's key target). This number increased from 283 in 2017/18 to 485 on 2018/19.
- 196 had less than 56 days' warning in 2017/18, This number fell to 65 by 2018/19.
- 56 were already homeless in 2017/18 and this number fell to 36 in 2018/19 (i.e. no time to prevent homelessness at point of referral).
