Description:	The Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government (MHCLG) has released the English Indices of Deprivation 2019 (ID 2019). The indices are combined into the composite Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019 (IMD 2019). This document will explore the IMD data for Peterborough and compare the differences in national and local ranks and deciles from IMD 2015 to IMD 2019. Whilst historical datasets can be compared, there are caveats.

Background

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019 (IMD 2019) is the official measure of relative deprivation for small area geographies called Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOAs), in England. Lower Layer Super Output Areas are a geographic hierarchy designed to improve the reporting of small area statistics in England and Wales. The Minimum population of an LSOA is 1,000 and the mean is 1,500. There is a total of 32,844 LSOAs nationally.

The Indices is made up of 7 key domains including: *Income, Employment, Health Deprivation & Disability, Education, Skills & Training, Crime, Barriers to Housing & Services and Living Environment.*

Key Findings

- Peterborough is the most deprived local authority in the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area.
- The Barriers to Housing & Service and Health Deprivation & Disability and Crime domains are, on average, Peterborough's lowest scoring (most deprived) domains when comparing across all domains.
- The Living Environment domain is, on average, Peterborough's highest scoring domains (least deprived)
- Peterborough has 6 LSOAs that have moved into the 20% most deprived nationally or locally since 2015.
- There is a large difference between the deprivation domain scores when comparing the urban and rural classified LSOAs in Peterborough. This is not the case across some of the other districts in Cambridgeshire. There is variation between the urban and rural LSOAs in Peterborough with the Income, Employment and Education, Skills and Training domains showing the greatest variation.
- Within Peterborough, income deprivation affecting older people (IDAOPI) is less prevalent than that with children (IDACI), but only by one decile rank (IDAOPI =4, IDACI = 3 where 1 is the most deprived).
- 2 LSOAs have become more deprived by 2 deciles since 2015, Peterborough 015A (West) (9th -> 7th) & Peterborough 023C (Hampton Vale) (5th -> 3rd).

District Overall Context

The national rank order of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough local authorities in terms of relative deprivation has changed since 2015.

National Ranking

Peterborough is ranked 51/317 of all local authorities nationally, by local authority score, where 1 is most deprived (Meaning Peterborough is the 266th least deprived district out of the 317 English Local Authorities). This compares to South Cambridgeshire which is 301 (16th least deprived), East Cambridgeshire which is 272/317 (45th least deprived), and Cambridge and Fenland that rank 210th and 237th respectively (117th and 80th respectively). Peterborough ranked as relative more deprived deprived than in the IMD 2015 when it ranked at 58/317 (the 259th least deprived of the English Local Authorities).

Local Ranking

Peterborough ranks as the most deprived local authority in the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area. Peterborough is still ranked as the most relatively deprived, then Fenland, then Cambridge. Huntingdonshire is now the third most relatively deprived, switching places with East Cambridgeshire which is now the second least relatively deprived. South Cambridgeshire is still the least relatively deprived in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. The ranking order is:

Least deprived – South Cambridgeshire
East Cambridgeshire
Huntingdonshire
Cambridge City
Fenland
Most Deprived - Peterborough

Analysis of individual deprivation domains across Peterborough

Figure 1, below, shows both the national and local district average deciles over the Peterborough LSOAs, broken down by each of the individual domain. The domains are ranked relative to Peterborough, rather than national ranking.




Figure 1: A breakdown of Peterborough average local and national decile rank by individual domain

The graph shows the percentage of LSOAs within each decile over Peterborough.




Figure 2: Peterborough LSOA national decile distribution by individual domain.

<u>Highest scoring domains (least deprived):</u>

In Peterborough, the highest scoring (least deprived) domain is Living Environment

Lowest scoring domains (more deprived):

However, Peterborough scores lower, on average, in all of the other domains. Barrier to Housing and Services, Health Deprivation and Disability, and Crime are the most deprived domain in Peterborough (see chart above).

There are **54/112** LSOAs in the lowest 3 deciles (1-3) and 19/112 LSOAs in the highest 3 deciles (8-10). It is clear therefore that Fenland has substantially more LSOA's in the lower deciles, than the higher deciles. The most deprived deciles are in the centre of the district.

Lowest scoring LSOAs (more deprived):

In general, the centre of the district is the most deprived. LSOAs Peterborough 007B (Dogthorpe), 013F (East), 021B, E, and F (Orton Longueville), 007E (Paston and Walton), 009D & E, 010D (Raventhorpe), 011E (Weston), 009B (Bretton) and 010A (North) have the most deprivation present in the district on the local IMD deciles (1).

Highest scoring LSOAs (least deprived):

In comparison, Peterborough **002C** (Werrington and **001B** (Glinton and Castor) rank the highest on both the local and national IMD deciles (9).

LSOA Changes in rank from IMD 2015

Cambridgeshire as a whole has more LSOAs in the less deprived deciles (6-10) than in 2015. Peterborough has become relatively more deprived since 2015, despite there being 2 less LSOA in the 10% most relatively deprived nationally as opposed to 2015. This is because are 6 more in the top 20% most relatively deprived nationally than in 2015. The maps below show the changes in the overall IMD deciles in Peterborough has occurred from 2015 to 2019.






Figure 4; Graphs showing the change in decile rank in the districts between 2015 and 2019

not coterminous, and therefore a best fit look up has been used. Ward boundaries are taken from the 2018 Ward boundaries. Minor changes have occurred between 2018 and 2019 boundaries which are not shown on these maps.

In general, the wards in the centre of Peterborough district are the most deprived. Average IMD deciles show that there is a large variation between wards, with the most deprived wards ranking in the 2nd decile, and the least deprived wards within the 8th decile. On a local average IMD, the wards are slightly more deprived, with the range being from 1st -8th decile.

Lowest scoring LSOAs (more deprived):

Central, Dogsthorpe, and North are the most deprived wards in the district, particularly on the local IMD, being in the 1st decile (where 1 is the most deprived).

Highest scoring Wards (least deprived):

Wittering, Glinton and Castor and Barnack are the least deprived ward (being in the 8th decile (where 1 is the most deprived).




Figure 7; Map of the National IMD and Local IMD by ward in Peterborough


Analysis of Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) and Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOPI) across Peterborough

National IDACI and IDAOPI deciles in Peterborough. IDACI and IDAOPI are supplementary indices in the Income domain, addressing the income deprivation affecting children (IDACI) and the Income Deprivation Affecting Older People (IDAOPI).

There are 11 LSOAs that are particularly deprived in the IDACI domain, all being in the 1st decile: Peterborough **008D** (North) Peterborough **007D** (Paston and Walton), Peterborough **009A** (Bretton)


Peterborough **007A & 007B** (Dogsthorpe), Peterborough **021A**, **021B & 021E** (Orton Longueville) Peterborough **021F** (Orton Waterville) Peterborough **007E** (Paston and Walton) Peterborough **009D & 009E** (Ravensthorpe).

51/112 of the LSOAs in Peterborough are in the 3 most deprived deciles for IDACI (1-3).

13/112 of the LSOAs in Peterborough are in the 3 least deprived deciles (8-10) for IDACI.

Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOPI)



The LSOAs that are most deprived in IDAOPI are: Peterborough **016C** (Ravensthorpe), Peterborough **012A**, **013B**, **014A &014B** (Central), Peterborough **013F & 014D** (East) Peterborough **010B** (North), Peterborough **010A** (North) Peterborough **021F** (Orton Waterville) and Peterborough **(007E)** Paston and Walton. These LSOAs are all in the 1st decile.

These LSOAs are different the most deprived IDACI LSOAs. There appears to be a particular hotspot in Central.

46/112 of the Peterborough LSOAs are in the 3 most deprived deciles (1-3) for IDAOPI.

19/112 of the Peterborough LSOAs are in the 3 least deprived deciles (8-10) for IDAOPI.




Figure 11; Map of the Urban and Rural LSOAs in Peterborough

In Peterborough, unlike other districts, the divide been urban and rural is relatively small, within the range of 2 deciles.

In all domains, rural LSOAs are less deprived (score higher) or the same as the urban ones. The biggest divide between rural and urban is in the Crime Domain (5th decile in Urban and 7th decile in rural).

Other districts have much smaller divides between the rural and urban LSOAs, but also have a more even spread of classifications.




Figure 12; Map of the average national IMD score in Rural and Urban by district
