Changes since EEFM 2017

- UK and regional forecasts dated July 2019
- Additional data for 2016-18 (and revised historical data)
- New 2016-based ONS sub-national population projections and household projections
- New ONS local authority GVA (balanced approach) data
- Re-estimated unemployment and migration coefficients based on more recent (1992-2018) data



Covid-19

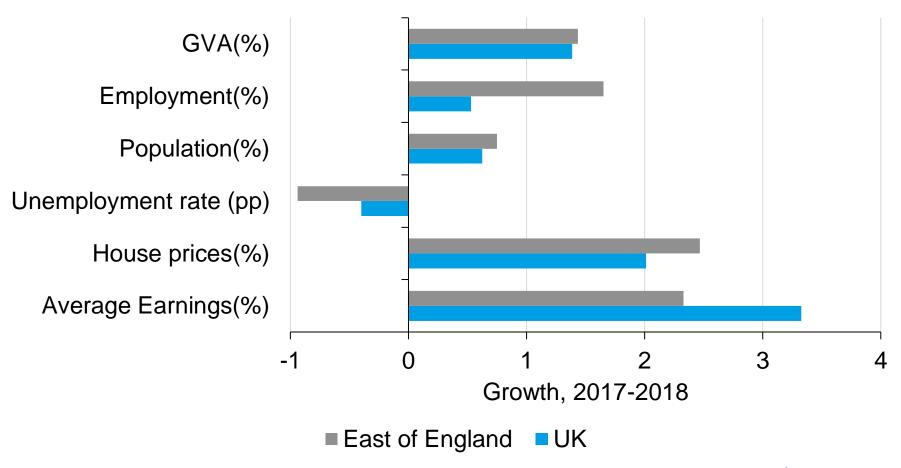
- EEFM 2019 was developed before the Covid-19 pandemic.

The UK economy outlook

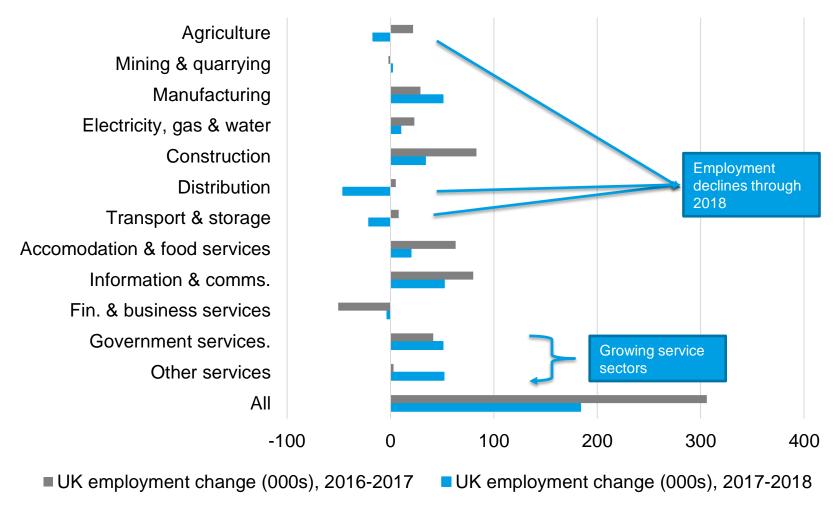


Recent developments in the East of England better than UK



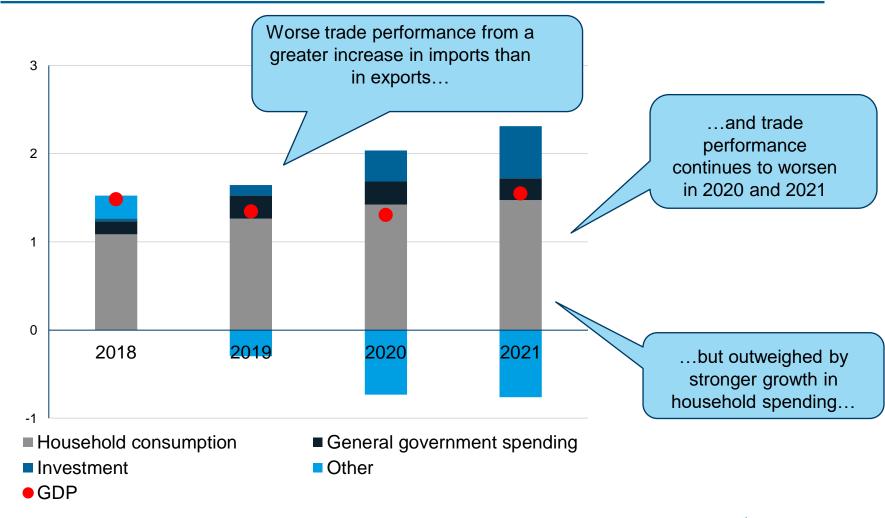


Labour market was stronger through 2017 than 2018 in the aggregate



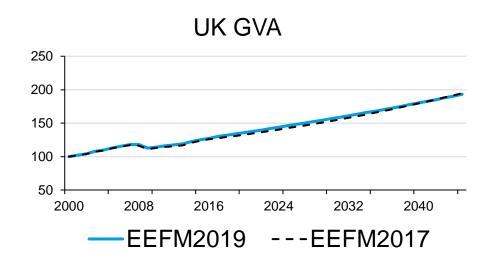


Short-term UK growth, 2018-21

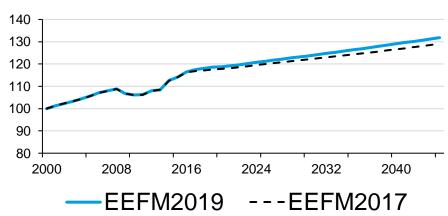




Long-term UK growth, 2022-45



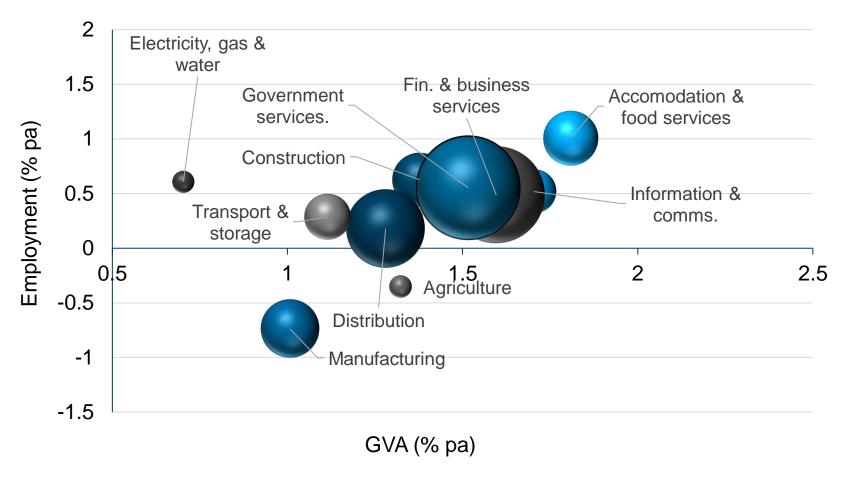




- Long-term GVA growth expected to maintain on a similar trajectory as previous forecast round

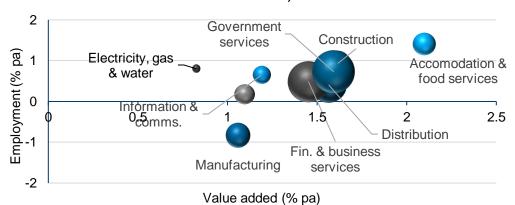

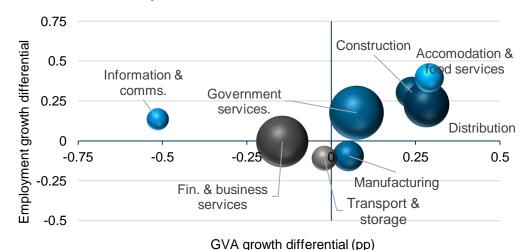


Sectoral prospects for the East of England

Sectoral outlook, 2022-45



Relative performance with UK, 2022-45



- Accommodation & food services and construction sectors' outlook brightest – expected to outperform the UK
- Employment expected to contract significantly in primary and manufacturing sectors
- GVA expected to grow at similar rates (over 1% pa) across most sectors, with outliers in accommodation & services, and primary sectors
- East of England expected to outperform the UK in terms of total employment and GVA growth

Things to remember when using the LA forecasts

- Data source issues with raw data
- EEFM is based on observed past trends only
- LA forecasts are constrained to the region
- The forecasts are policy-neutral and unconstrained
- Reality is more complex than any model
- Forecasting models will not all agree

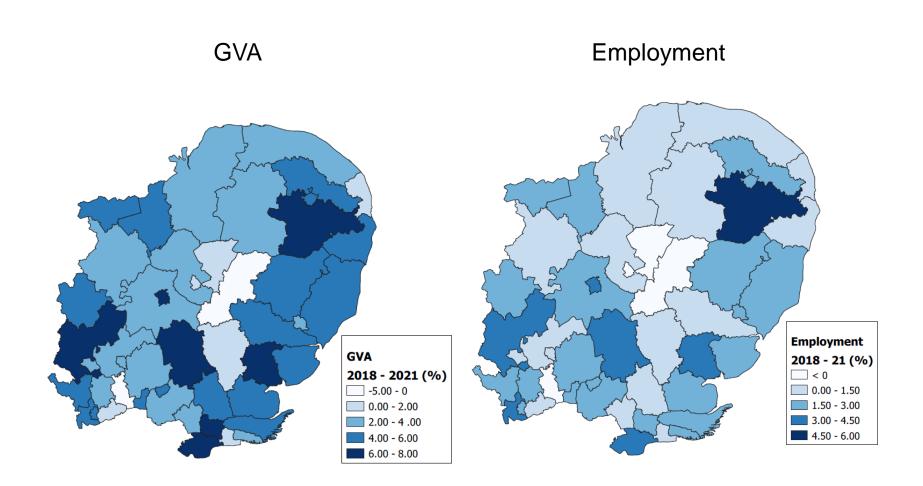

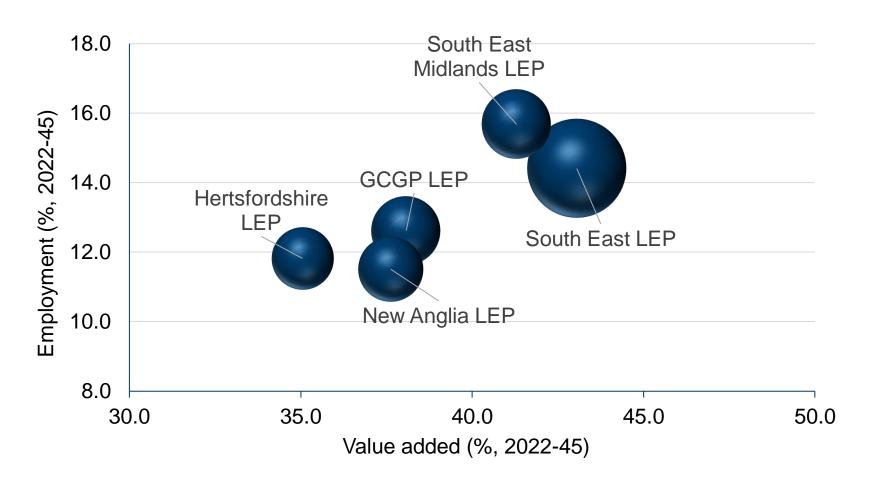

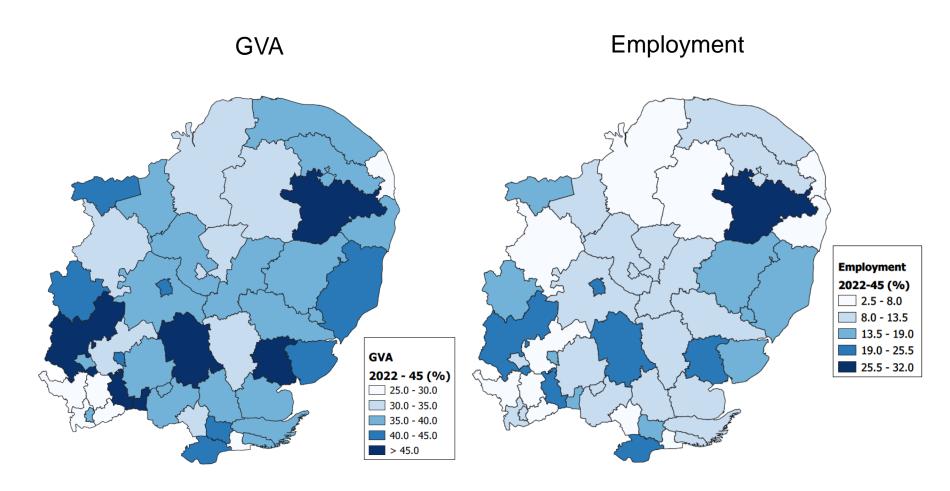
GVA and employment growth, LEPs

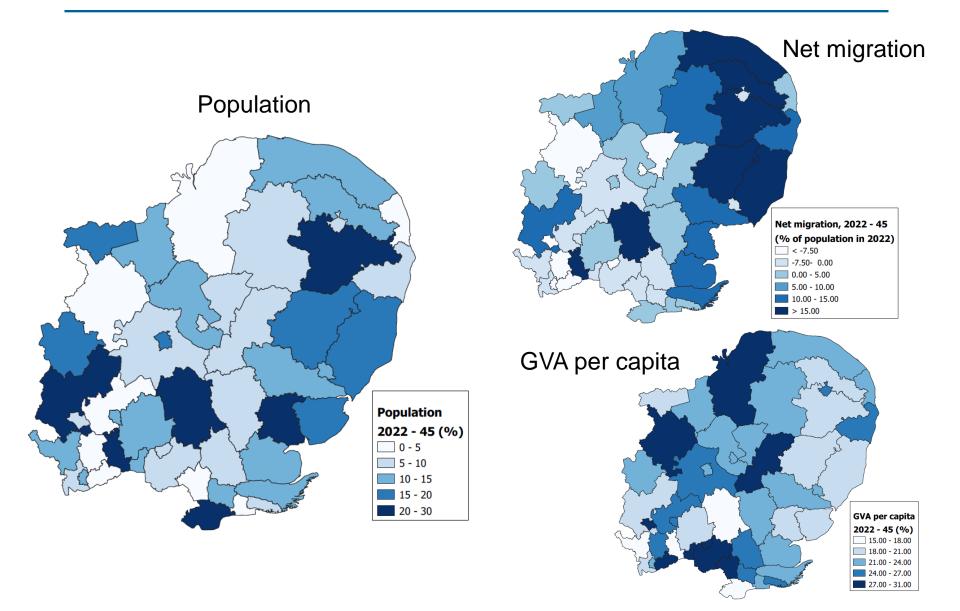
