
An overview of apprenticeship starts delivered in the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area – Q2 2022/23

Delivery to date (January 2022/23)


- Up to Q2 October 2022/23 there have been **2,898 apprenticeship starts*** across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. This is +3% more than the number of starts up to Q2 in 2021/22, where there were 2,803 apprenticeship starts.
- Nationally starts were down by -4% when comparing starts up to Q2 in 2022/23 to starts up to Q2 in 2021/22.

Starts by Level

- In Q2 (November 2022 January 2023) there have been 2,898 apprenticeship starts* across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough
- Up to Q2 of 2022/23, the largest proportion of starts were in Level 3 apprenticeships (43%), this is the same as the national proportion (43%).
- Across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, there were higher proportions of apprenticeship starts in Level 5 (11% in C&P compared to 7% nationally) and Level 7 apprenticeships (8% in C&P and 7% nationally) compared to what was observed nationally. And a lower proportion of Level 2 (21% compared to 24% nationally) and Level 6 apprenticeships (7% compared to 9% nationally)
- While the total number of starts across the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area in all apprenticeship Levels increased across Q2 in 2022/23, there is some variation between each level:
 - Level 2 apprenticeships saw the largest increase in this period with +81 (+15%) more starts compared to the same period in 2021/22. Nationally, Level 2 apprenticeships saw the largest decrease across all levels (-9,292, -17%)
 - Level 5 and Level 6 apprenticeships were the only levels to see a decrease of -44 starts (-12%) and -4 (-2%) in this period. Nationally, Level 5 apprenticeships increased by +402 (+3%) and Level 6 apprenticeships increased by +1,786 (+12%)




Apprenticeship starts across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough by level over the last three years, including national comparison for 2022/23



Starts by subject area

- While apprenticeships have seen an increase in the number of starts, the impact on individual subject areas has varied when considering starts across Q2 in 2022/23 compared with equivalent periods in 2021/22 and 2020/21.
- Comparing Q2 2022/23 with the same point in the previous year, the single biggest decrease in starts was in the Business, Administration and Law subject area, with -98 fewer starts (-12%)
- Similarly, the Health, Public Services and Care sector accounted for a lower percentage of apprenticeship starts across the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area across Q2 in 2022/23, at 23%, compared with 27% for the same period in 2021/22. Starts across this sector decreased by -45 (-6%).
- The Agriculture, Horticulture and Animal Care sector accounted for a higher percentage of apprenticeship starts across the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area across Q2 in 2022/23 at 7%, compared with 4% for the same period in 2021/22. This sector saw starts increase by +74 (+56%), the largest increase across all sectors.
- Health, Public Services and Care accounts for a higher proportion of national starts up to Q2 (26%) than it does in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough (23%). A higher proportion of national starts are also in the construction subject area (10% nationally compared to 8% in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough).







*Sectors which account for less than 3% of starts in the Greater Cambridge area and nationally in Q1 of 2022/23 have been included within the Other category. This includes Education and Training; Leisure, Travel and Tourism; Arts, Media and Publishing, Science and Mathematics, History, Philosophy and Theology and Social Sciences

Starts by age groups

- Of the 2,898 apprenticeship starts up to Q2 in 2022/23, 1,260 (43%) starts were among 25+ year olds, 885 (31%) starts were among 19-24 year olds and those aged 19 and under accounted for 753 (26%) starts.
- There has been a higher proportion (+3 percentage points) of apprenticeship starts in 2022/23 up to Q2 among those aged under 19 compared to the same period in 2021/22. Starts increased by +99 (+15%)
- There were lower proportions of those aged 19-24 and 25+ undertaking apprenticeships compared to the equivalent period 2021/22. Starts across the 19-24 age group decreased by -12 (-1%) and starts across the 25+ age group increased by +8 (+1%).
- Similarly, there were lower proportions of learners aged 19-24 starting apprenticeships nationally across Q2 in 2022/23 compared to the equivalent period 2021/22. Starts in this age group decreased by -5,247 (-8%)

- The largest provider in the area to date in 2022/23 was **Anglia Ruskin University**, which accounted for 10% (303) of apprenticeship starts. The college accounted for 12% (325) of all starts up to Q2. This provider saw a -7% decrease in the number of Q2 starts between 2021/22 and 2022/23. **Anglia Ruskin University** was the largest provider in 2021/22, accounting for 10% of all apprenticeships
- Inspire Education Group are the second largest apprenticeship provider in the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area up to Q2 2022/23, accounting for 9% (270) of all starts. Inspire Education Group have increased their provision by 56%
- West Suffolk College is the only provider in the top five up to Q2 2022/23 to not have been in the top five for the previous year, it was 6th.
- The College of Animal Welfare was 5th in apprenticeship starts over the whole of 2021/22, accounting for 4% (200) of starts. Up to Q2 2022/23 it is the 6th largest provider accounting for 4% (110) of starts. This is an increase of +54 (+104%) from the same point last year
