
What is Changing Futures?

Leadership academy

Five people from across the Changing Futures partnership completed the <u>Making Every Adult Matter Systems Leadership</u> <u>Programme</u> in June 2023.

They form our first 'system agent network' (initially for that group only) to see how the learning can be applied in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough and how 'system agents' can support one another in affecting system change.

The ambition for Changing Futures is to invite more people who want to become system agents to become part of the new network, enabling more system change.

We hope to provide opportunities for the system agent network to upskill and to participate in system leadership training. Watch this space for further updates and how to get involved.




A follow up workshop is planned for Wednesday 15 November to explore what we would want from a Trauma Informed Network and how might it work.

- Raise awareness of the various enquiries and the stage each is • at, and how they are progressing.
- Get you involved, whether a topic is part of your life or your work, or is new to you but you have something to contribute.
- Make sure the enquiries are inclusive, and to help you get involved by sharing who to contact if you want to get involved.
- Provide a place which makes it easy to find linked documents, miro boards, lucid charts and other materials.

- Keep track of our progress as Changing Futures progresses.

Encouragingly there was a lot of positive feedback on support provided by individual services.

The next step is to test the themes with experts by experience, identifying the topics they wish to pursue and what they want to see change. We hope to reach more people as the co-production group progresses and grows, and have learnt that holding the sessions in an open space where people already feel comfortable helps more people get involved.

We have a new case study which was discussed at the Strategic Board.

Leon's story highlights use of the trusted person approach, including Leon building his circle of trust, and how other people across the system starting to adopt the trusted person approach and apply the lessons learned to help other individuals.

Trusted person approach

We are hoping to work with partner organisations to see if and how the Trusted Person approach can be used outside the Change Futures operational groups.

There is a workshop planned for 11 October with the Streets to Homes partnership based in Cambridge to explore applying the approach, which has been used by the Changing Futures team for past 18 months. We are keen to work out how best to share it more widely and learn from others.
